A Catholic is obliged to confess serious sins in kind and number to a priest. If one is conscious of having committed serious sin, Confession ought to be made before receiving the Eucharist.

Baptism: Please call to arrange for your child's baptism before or soon after birth. A Godparent must be a Catholic in good standing.

Anointing of the Sick:

Please call for a priest to celebrate this Sacrament of Healing and Forgiveness for someone who is seriously ill or in danger of death. Do not wait until the sick person is unconscious.

Matrimony:

All Catholics ought to seek to have their marriage blessed by the Church so as to live in God's good graces & receive the Eucharist. Marriage cannot validly exist between baptized persons unless it is also a sacrament (Canon 1055.2). Contact a priest about a year prior to the intended date of marriage to ensure proper preparation.

Confirmation: Need to complete your Sacraments of Initiation? Call Mrs. Kachnowski at 908-245-6572. She will help you prepare for confirmation. If they can do so without serious inconvenience, Catholics ought to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation before being admitted to marriage (Canon 1065).

OCIA: Desire baptism? Called to be a Catholic Christian? Contact Deacon David at 908-245-6572 and he will help you discern God's call to holiness.

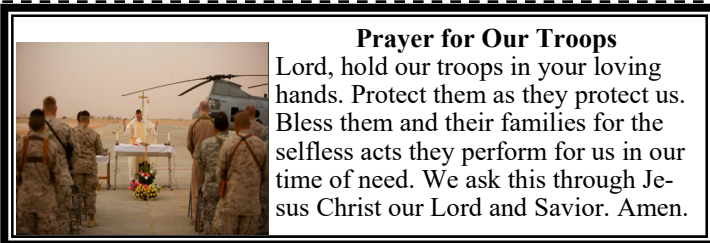

God's love for us is perfect love. Our love for God is imperfect. The love that God has for us is agape, the Greek word for love that implies a total self-giving to the other. Our love for God usually ranges between storge and philos. Storge (στοργή) is the Greek word that is akin to loyalty or familial love. So many of us have a loyalty to God. We are Christians and as members of the Catholic Church we identify with our Catholicism. We believe in God the Father, in Jesus Christ his Son, and in God the Holy Spirit. This is a natural love that binds relations. But this love is based on *affection so is liable to 'go bad', and to be corrupted by such forces as jealousy, ambivalence and smothering* [C.S. Lewis].¹ So when God disappoints us, we could easily reject Him or blame Him or even deny Him.

Another type of love is eros (έρως) or being in love. This is connected to sexual love but it has spiritual or moral significance too, in that it can lead to evil as well as good. A man and a woman can be attracted to one another and fall in love, which will lead to marriage and new life. Likewise it can lead to evil, *n.b.* Romeo and Juliet whose love lead them into a suicide, or two men who find themselves in a sexual relationship, or lovers in an abusive relationship.

A third type, philos (φιλία), is the deep and sincere love between friends that endures. True friends share common values, interests or activities. Friendship is, "the least biological, organic, instinctive, gregarious and necessary...the least natural of loves" [C.S. Lewis]¹ since it is not needed to preserve the species. An example of this friendship is the love of David and Jonathan in the Bible. C.S. Lewis said, "to the Ancients, Friendship seemed the happiest and most fully human of all loves; the crown of life and the school of virtue. The modern world, in comparison, ignores it"¹. But there are imperfections in this love too. It has a potential for cliqueness, anti-authoritarianism, and pride.¹

Finally there is agape (αγάπη). This love is unconditional love, perfect love in which one loves the other for the other's sake. In life this can be found in couples who have endured the imperfections of the other loves and have matured in their love for each other, willing to give totally of themselves. As St. Paul said, "Defer to one another. Wives submit to your husbands...husbands love your wives."

When Jesus asks St. Peter the 3-fold question, "Do you love me?" we must look at the Greek. The first two times Jesus asked, "Do you love-agapé me?" Peter responds, "Yes, I love-philos you." Finally on the third attempt, Jesus said, "Do you love-philos me?" and St. Peter said, "I love-philos you." Then Jesus told him that in time, by the end of his life, St. Peter will love-agapé Jesus when he gives his life on the cross, giving totally of himself for love of Jesus and the newly created Church. Peter's love would go from philos to agapé in a life time. So if you feel that you yet do not love Jesus enough, in time and with prayer, devotion, and great deeds, you will come to love Jesus as did the Apostles, the Blessed Mother and all the saints.

ADDICTION TREATMENT REFERRAL PROGRAM for persons suffering from acute addiction

Within 48 hours of receipt of referral, NJRC will provide linkage to and commencement of addiction treatment services to referred persons. These services will include but are not limited to linkages for intake, the creation of a personalized long-term treatment plan, detoxification, ambulatory withdrawal management, induction on Suboxone or buprenorphine or the initiation of Vivitrol, residential treatment, intensive outpatient treatment, and/or induction of Medication Assisted Treatment, as needed and appropriate. Where appropriate, court-involved persons and justice-involved veterans will also be enrolled and referred to NJRC's Orientation and additional wrap-around services, including job training and employment, mental health and medical care, transportation, and license restoration services.



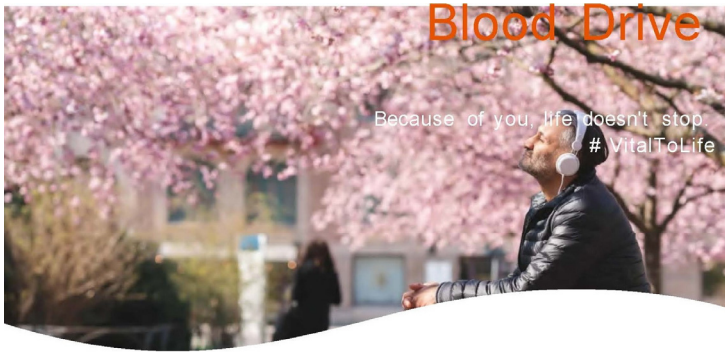
