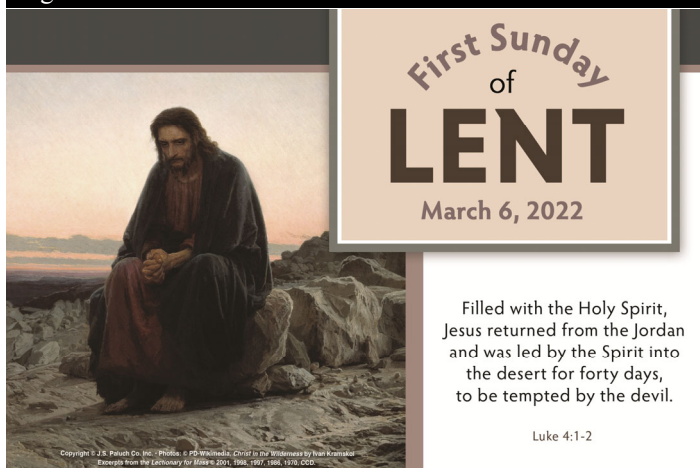

The Stations of the Cross are a popular and familiar Catholic devotion which commemorates the Passion and death of our Lord Jesus Christ. Each of the fourteen stations represents an event which occurred during Jesus' Passion and death at Calvary on Good Friday.

The devotion originated in the late 4th century when pilgrims flocked to the Holy Land from all parts of the world to visit the land of Jesus. Heading the list of places they visited was the Church of the Holy Sepulcher, which had been built by the Emperor Constantine in 335 AD atop Calvary and the tomb of Jesus. Over the years, the route of pilgrim processions -- beginning at the ruins of the Fortress Antonia and ending at the church of the Holy Sepulcher -- was accepted as the way that Jesus went to his death. It was known as the "Via Dolorosa," the "Sorrowful Way." Today, it winds through the crowded areas of Jerusalem's Old City, and pilgrims still travel it in prayer.

During the time of the crusades (1095-1270), it became popular for pilgrims in the Holy Land to walk in the footsteps of Jesus to Calvary. After the Islamic invasion and capture of the Holy Land, pilgrimages were too dangerous. As a result, the Stations of the Cross became a popular "substitute pilgrimage" in Churches throughout Europe. Promotion of the devotion to the Stations began in earnest with the Franciscans, who were given custody of the Holy Places in the Holy Land in the 1300s. Those who risked the dangers of travel to the Holy Land brought to their homes the memory of this devotion and replicated their memory in countless Churches throughout Europe.

The Stations represent critical events from Scripture or tradition of Jesus' journey to Calvary. The devotion may be conducted personally by the faithful, making their way from one station to another and saying the prayers, or by having an officiating celebrant move from cross to cross while the faithful make the responses. The stations themselves must consist of, at the very least, fourteen wooden crosses, pictures alone do not suffice. The pictures enhance devotion and allow those unable to read to understand the journey.

The Stations of the Cross remains to this day a popular devotion, particularly during the Lenten Season. Here at the Church of the Assumption we pray the "Stations" every Friday during Lent at 7:30 P.M. This is a wonderful opportunity for families to pray together. If you have never had the opportunity to make this "local pilgrimage of faith"; come join us and walk with us and Jesus along the "sorrowful way" toward Easter.

**The Paschal Fast and Precept:** The days of FAST and ABSTINENCE during Lent are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. All other Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence. On a Fast Day, only one (1) full meal is permitted, and two (2) smaller meals which added together would not exceed the full meal. Those between 18 and 59 years are obligated to fast. On a day of Abstinence, no meat may be eaten. Those who reached the age of 14 are obligated to abstain from meat on days appointed. The time to fulfill the Paschal Precept (Easter Duty) extends from the First Sunday of Lent (March 6, 2022) to the Solemnity of the Holy Trinity (June 12, 2022). The faithful are bound to receive Holy Communion at least once a year during the time of the Paschal Precept. The Sacrament of Confession prepares for a worthy observance of the Paschal Precept.

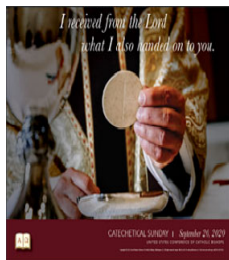

**Knights' Corner (Council #3240)**

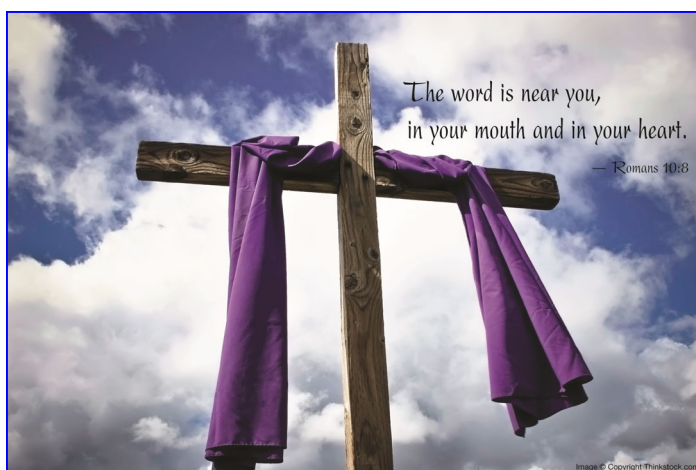

Most of us are familiar with fasting, abstinence and "giving things up" during the Lenten season, as we prepare for Easter Sunday, but let us look at actually doing something of service. The Corporal (physical) and Spiritual (holy) Works of Mercy are ideal ways to be of service....Feed the hungry, clothe the naked, shelter the homeless, be patient, pray....

We are asking all parishioners (adults and children alike) to take a moment to visit the Tree of Challenge, which will be located in the center of the Church by the Baptismal font after Ash Wednesday; and take a challenge to be completed during the 6 weeks of Lent.
